8th would say that it "looks like a normal burger". Ever get the creepy crawlies? Maybe from a spider?

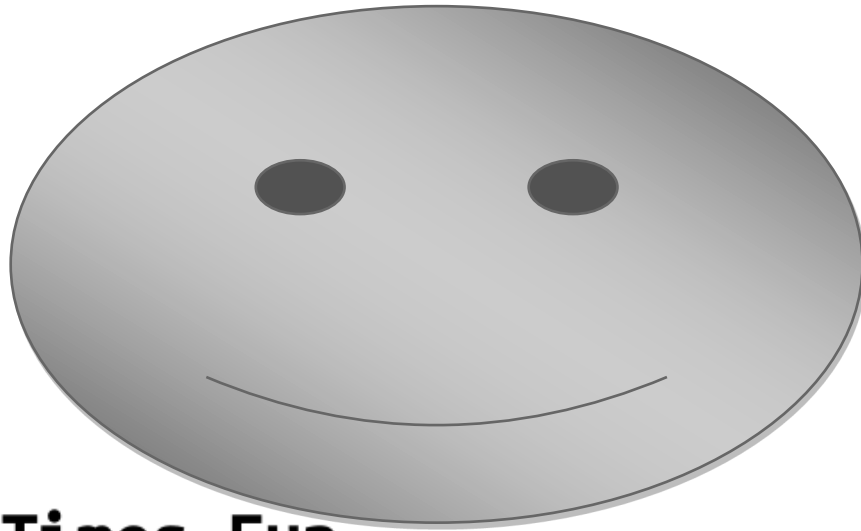
Well in Siem Reap, tarantulas are sold by many street vendors. "looks like it would be greatly served with a side of ketchup", That is very...interesting
