Allie Adams states that her favorite smells are Christmas cookies and her favorite flavor is pumpkin waffles.

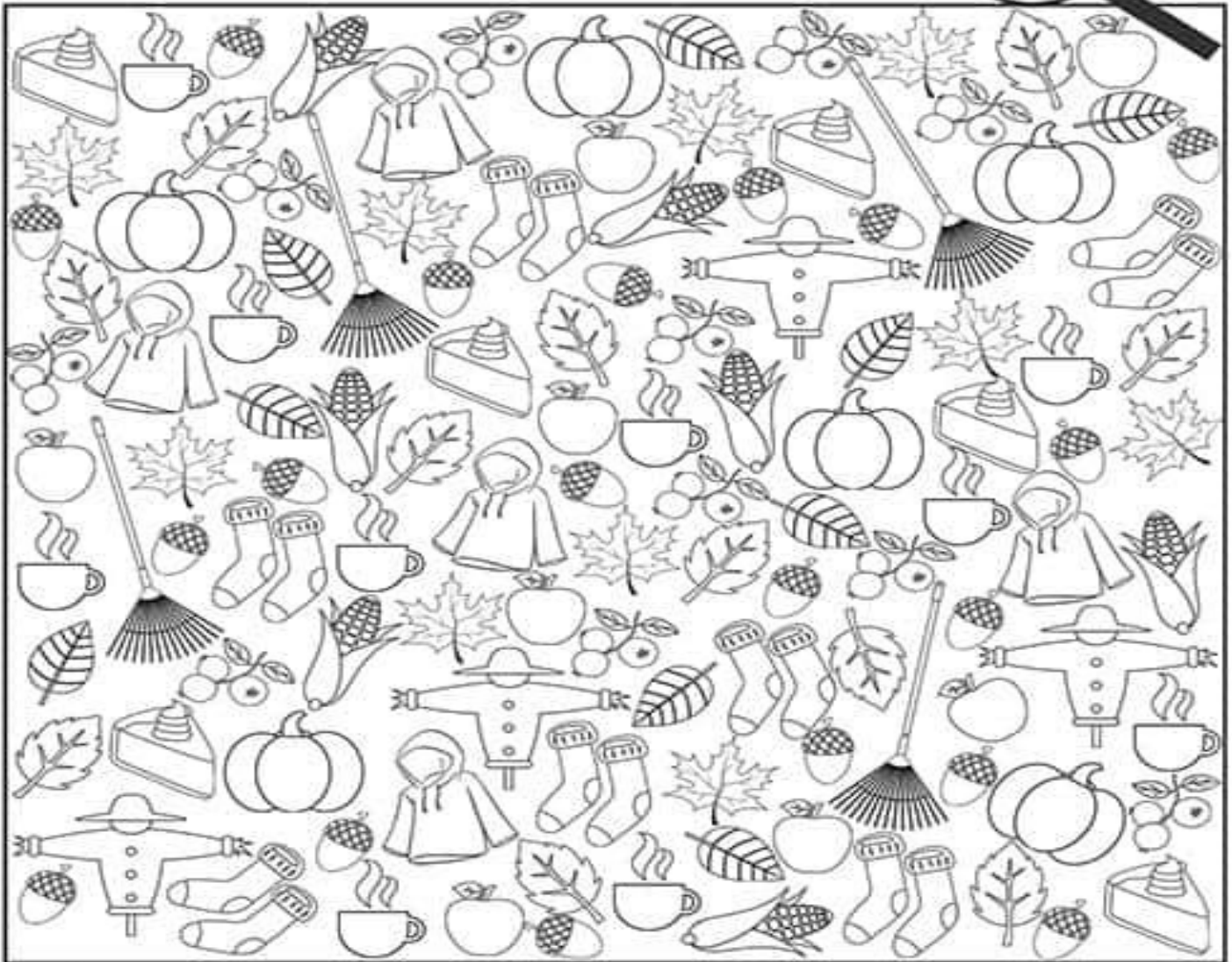
