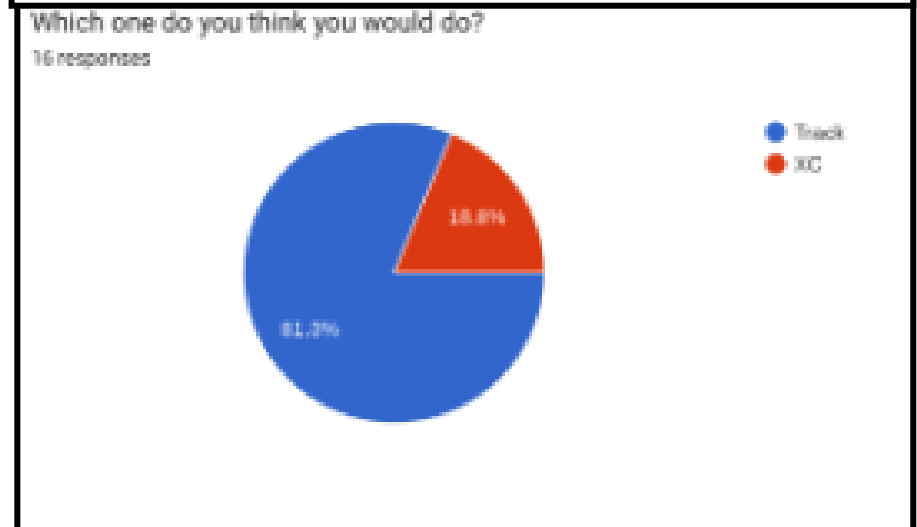
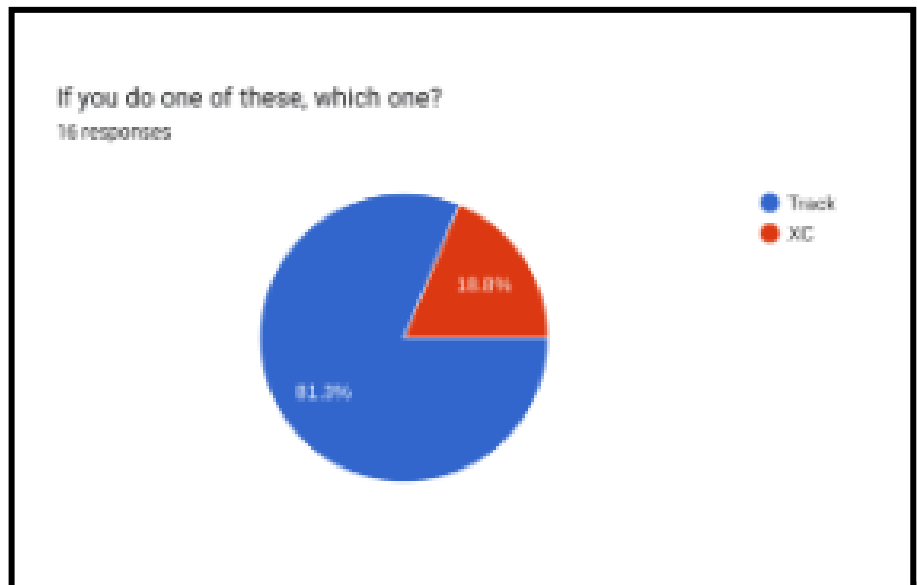


# Track or Cross Country?

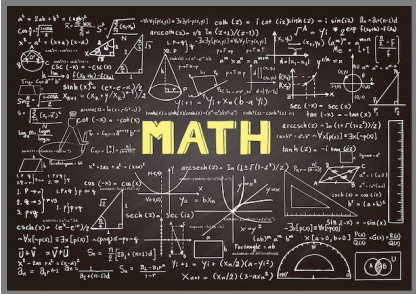
